Sandfield Close Primary School

Overview of Delivery

Leicester City in the Community attend Sandfield Close once a week across the academic year, delivering the Premier League Primary Stars programme. This programme consists of teacher CPD, through supporting and delivering PE lessons, targeted interventions (English & physical literacy) and extra-curricular opportunities through after-school clubs and enrichment trips.

Since the start of academic year, all 250 pupils have taken part in the programme, across 228 sessions that have been delivered. All teachers have received CPD in PE, through working closely with the LCitC coach. After-school football clubs have taken place, in every term throughout the academic year. These clubs have been on offer to all year groups, with one half term being delivered to just girls.

The high-quality delivery LCitC provide at Sandfield Close is based around the four Premier League Primary Stars values of being connected, fair, ambitious and inspiring whilst also incorporating the values of the school.

Teacher CPD

As part of the Primary Stars programme, we focus on improving teachers' skills through CPD in PE. Teachers have benefited greatly from this through the support of a Leicester City coach. This collaboration has allowed teachers to learn new games, ideas, and setup strategies while keeping children active and engaged. Feedback from teachers has been overwhelmingly positive, highlighting the significant impact of this partnership on their confidence moving forward.

Interventions

Mornings have been dedicated to targeted interventions, including Premier League Reading Stars for upper KS2, comprehension for lower KS2 and physical activity interventions for KS1, to support physical literacy and fundamental movement skills.

Extra-Curricular

Lunchtimes and after-school have been dedicated to football clubs. At lunchtimes, the boys and girls football teams have attended training. After-school club has been at full capacity of 16 for all year groups spread across the academic year.

Case Study – Anya Y6

- Why was the participant identified?

Anya was identified for the case study because of her fantastic attitude and dedication in all sessions delivered by LCitC. She has attended everything on offer to her and is always the first person to sign up. She has taken part in PE lessons, lunchtime clubs, after school clubs, eco clubs and even been on a residential trip this academic year with us. Due to her commitment, she is a key part of the girls football team at school. Anya has been an integral part of the rise of girls football at Sandfield and is a fantastic role model to other girls aspiring to play. One of the best skills Anya possesses and demonstrates is her resilience, she is never deterred by setbacks or losing. She participates with a smile on her face and doesn't let anything affect her.

- How was the project delivered to support the individual?

Anya has attended all LCitC sessions available to her whilst at school, which is a big reason for her confidence and role model skills. She has taken part in PE sessions with the rest of her class for the past three academic years, attended multiple girls only after-school clubs as well as mixed after-school clubs, playing with both boys and girls.

- What impact did the project have on the individual?

The impact this project has had on Anya is clear to see; all sessions she takes part in she does with confidence and is always leading by example. All of her peers have nothing but good words to say about her and this is the ultimate compliment. She is always eager to help others when needed.

- Evidence

Anya was presented with an award at our Education awards night recognising her strengths and hard work. Anyone who works with Anya, I'm 100% sure would have the same impression of her.

Additional Information

- Play on the Pitch Event

4 pupils from Sandfield were chosen to attend a Play on the Pitch event at King Power Stadium! The pupils took part in some multi-sports activities that included football, dodgeball, foot-golf and frisbee. Children thoroughly enjoyed their evening and said they will never forget this opportunity!

- Premier League Mascot Experience

In February, Summar in Year 6 had the opportunity to walk the Leicester City team and the officials on to the pitch before their match with Brentford. Summar was chosen for her dedication and hard work in football over the past year. She was surprised by Filbert Fox in assembly to present the opportunity and couldn't wait for the day! She experienced a meet and greet with the players and got to play on the pitch as the players were warming up! Summar and her Dad had a fantastic evening despite the poor result.

- Education Awards

In June, Leicester City in the Community hosted their first ever Education awards, where children, staff and partners came together to celebrate the success of the school year. 3 pupils from Sandfield Close won awards on the night and thoroughly deserved these. Anya won a Premier League Primary Stars award nominated by Jordan -
