



Year Reception - Home Learning (2024-2025)

At Sandfield Close Primary School, we understand that home learning can help to enhance a child's progress and development, and therefore we have put together this information to help you to support your child's learning at home.

We understand that many of our children take part in extra-curricular activities, and as these play an important part in developing skills such as independence, teamwork, communication and problem-solving, we have tried to make sure that the home learning tasks that we would like children to complete are both manageable and purposeful.

Reading

- Children must learn how to recognise letter sounds and say letter sounds correctly by following their speed sounds video on Google Classrooms
- Children will learn to blend sounds into words and read their green words by following a video on Google Classrooms
- An adult or older sibling reads the Shared Storybook at least 3 times a week and talks about the book.
- A list of age-appropriate recommended texts has been attached below for parents/carers to read to their child (if they would like to read extra stories to their child). This can also be found on our school website in our curriculum-Year Reception
- A document containing questions has also been attached below to give parents/carers an idea about the types of questions that they can ask their child.

Later in the academic year (When your child can blend their sounds into words)

- Children must read aloud their Book Bag Book for 10 minutes every evening and read their Read Write Inc online e- book.
- Where possible, this must be to an adult who then talks about the book with their child

Handwriting.

- Children will follow the Speed Sound Video on Google Classrooms and learn how to form their letters correctly

Spelling

- Children will follow the speed sound video and use their Fred fingers to learn how to spell words

Maths

- Develop the key skill of counting objects -saying the number names in order and matching one number name to each item
 - Sing songs and number rhymes and read stories that involve counting
 - Play games which involve counting
 - Spot numerals around in your environment
