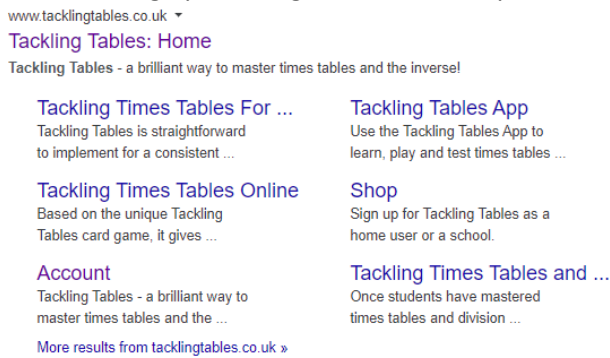
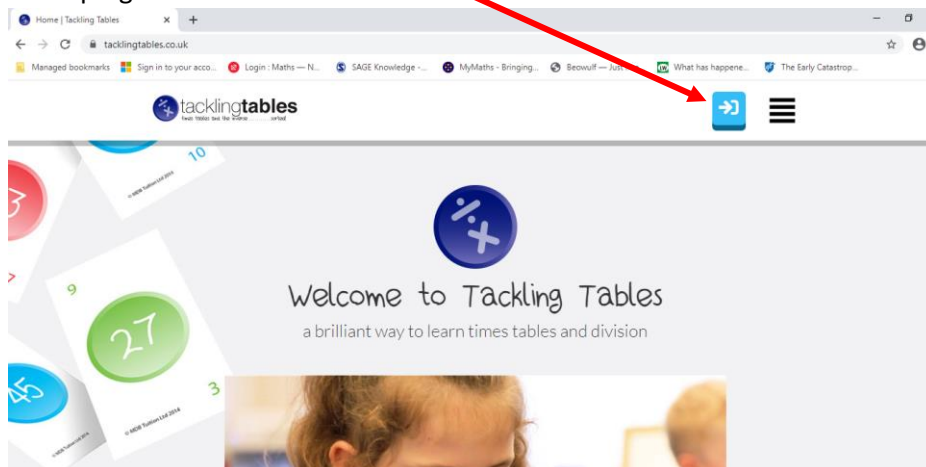


Hello Parents and Carers. This is a guide for using Tackling Tables. This is a programme we at Sandfield Close bought to support children learn their times tables in 2019 when it became available. Children use the card game in school. This is a reminder about how to help your child access Tackling Tables.


1. Type in Tackling Tables into a search engine like Google.
2. This will bring up Tackling Tables to the top of the screen. Click on the link:



3. This will take you to the home screen for Tackling Tables. Click on the blue login button on the top right hand side of the screen:



4. This will be the next screen you see:

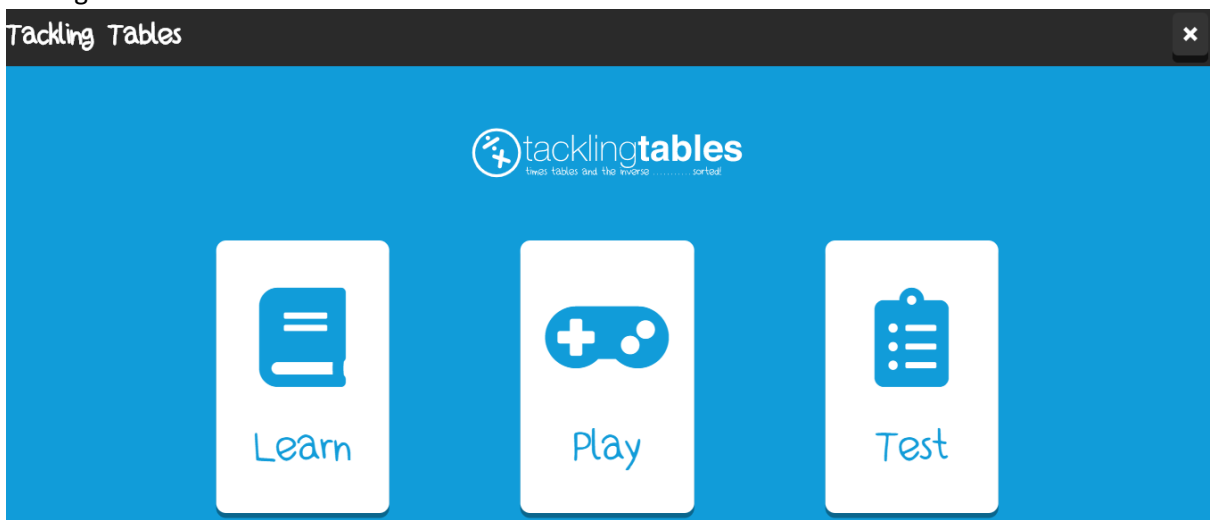


The school reference must always be **SCPS**. Please make sure this is always visible when logging in.

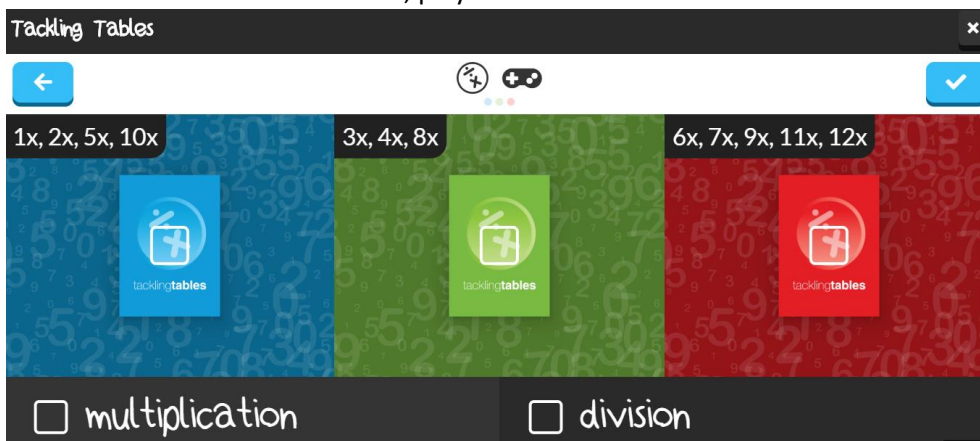
Enter your child's **username** in this box. The username your child has been given will be their first name and surname separated by a dot.

Enter your child's **password** in this box. The password your child has been given comprises of two words and a numeral.

5. When you have logged your child in, they will see this screen. Children can learn, play or test themselves on their timetables. We recommend children learning and playing every day and testing once a week:

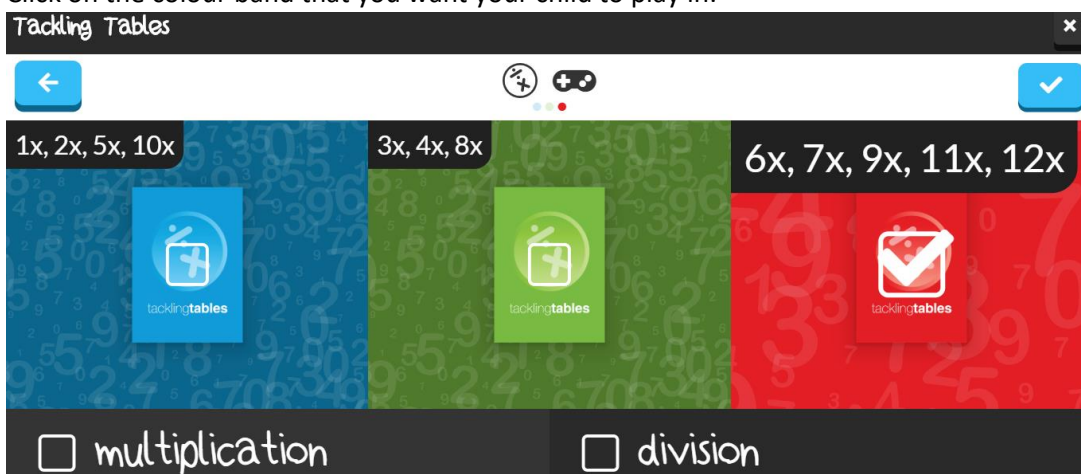


6. Click on the boxes to access learn, play or test. You will then see this screen:

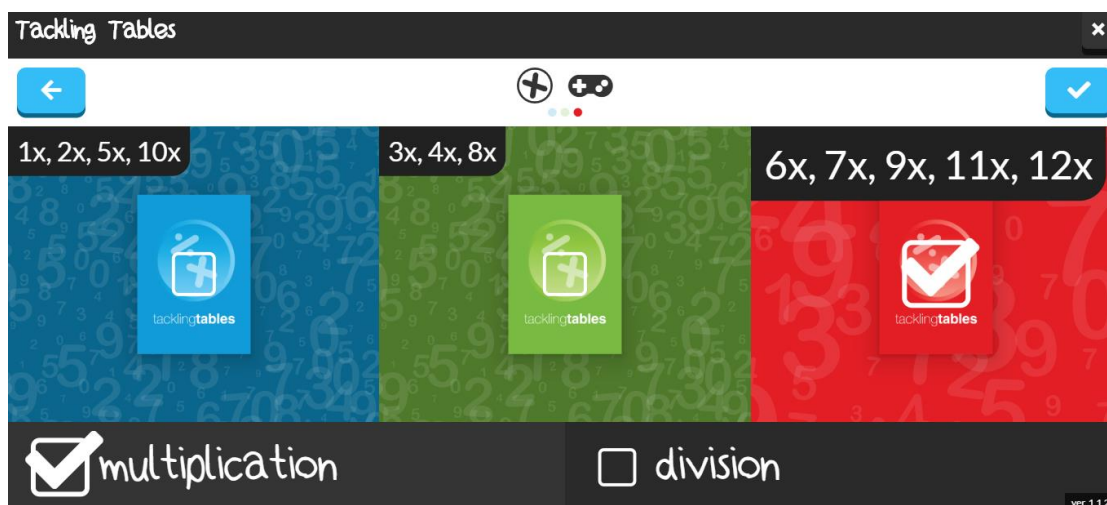


7. Blue represents the times tables that children are required to learn by the end of Year 2.
Green represents the times tables that children are required to learn by the end of Year 3.
Red represents the times tables that children are required to learn by the end of Year 4.

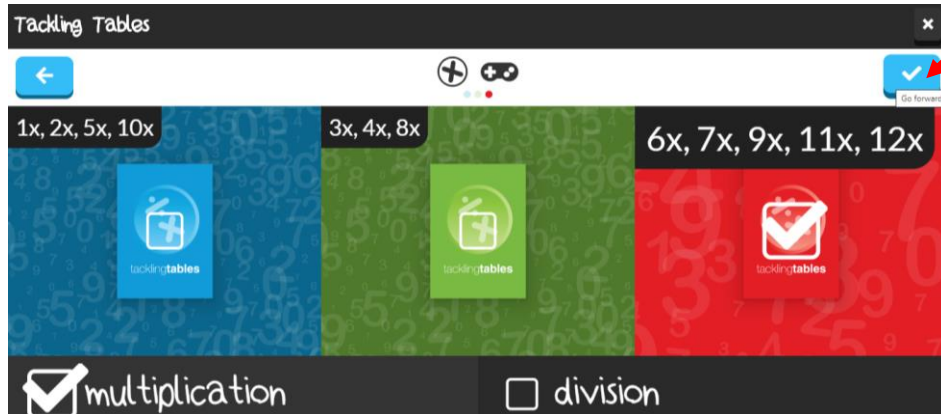
8. Click on the colour band that you want your child to play in:



9. Next click on either multiplication or division:



10. Next click the blue arrow on the top right hand corner of the screen to move forward:



11. The next screen will ask how many players are wanting to play. This is a great chance to challenge your child who will love it or for siblings to play:



12. The following screen will ask how many minutes they want to play for:



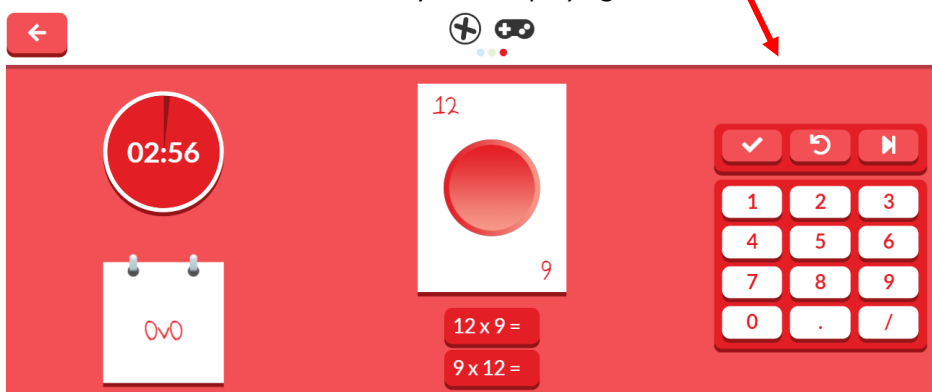
13. You will be asked if you would like to see a tutorial. You can click X for no:



14. You will be then asked if you are ready to go. Click the arrow for yes:



15. Children are timed to answer questions. They can use the keypad on the right hand side of the screen or the numbers on a keyboard if playing on a PC.



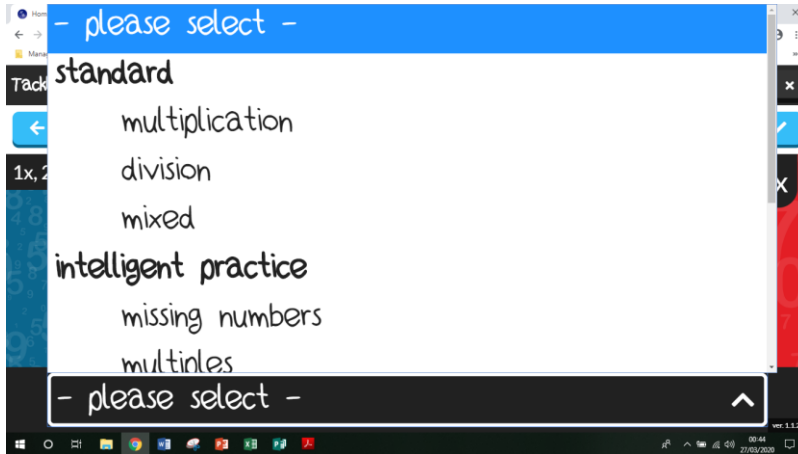
16. When children finish playing they return to the home screen. To play or learn or test, they need to press the blue button with a controller on it which is the top right hand corner.



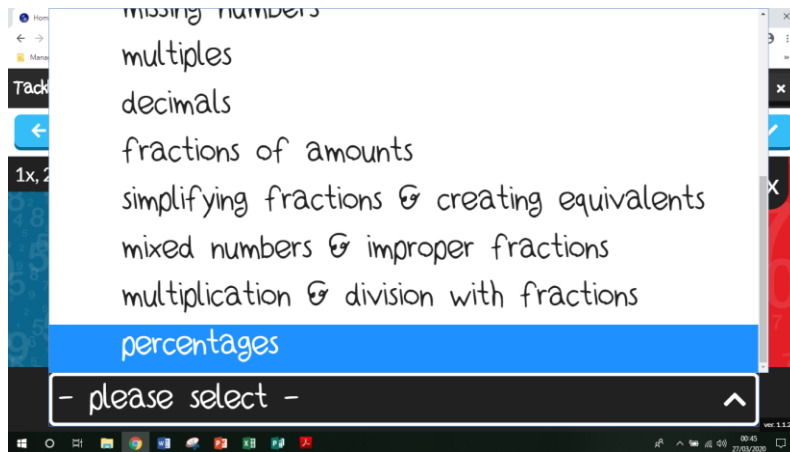
17. When in test mode, click a colour and then the select menu will appear at the bottom of the



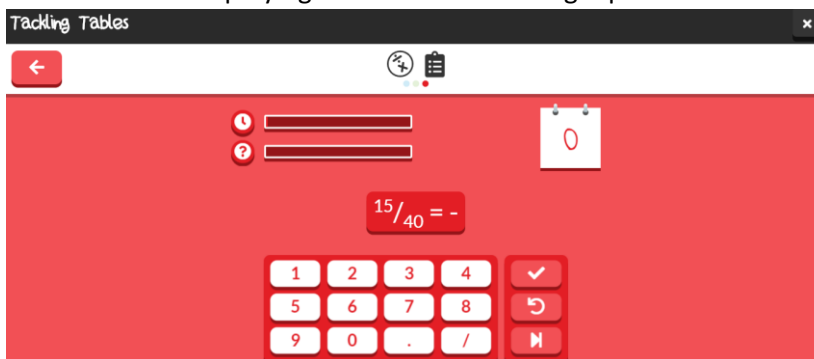
18. Click on the select button and you will see this screen:



19. Look at the scroll bar on the right. This will allow you to scroll down for further options. There are many options here that children in Years 5 and Year 6 are required to learn, using knowledge gained from learning their times tables knowledge up to 12 x 12 by the end of Year 4:



20. Click on any of these to try a test. You will be asked again about how long your child would like to spend on a test and whether they would like a tutorial before starting. The picture below is from 'simplifying fractions and creating equivalents'.



21. When your child has finished and would like to leave the site, visit the top right hand blue
